The 2019 college football season is officially upon us and the new trend for quarterbacks who do not win the starting job is to pack up and leave. There are thousands of players in the transfer portal each year and that trend continues to grow.

Justin Fields, Tate Martell, and Kelly Bryant are big time quarterbacks who did not buy into the team when they found out they did not earn the job and packed their things. They wanted nothing to do with their programs that promised them they would excel and make it to the next level.

One quarterback who stood out from the rest was Jalen Hurts from the University of Alabama. In 2018, Hurts lost the starting position to Tua Tagovailoa after being benched in the second half of the National Championship when playing Georgia. Tagovailoa was not playing one hundred percent and was finally subbed out in the fourth quarter of the SEC Championship just before throwing his last touchdown to bring Alabama back within seven. It was now Jalen Hurts time to show people he was still the real deal.

A year ago, Jalen was being replaced by Tua in the National Championship and now Jalen had his shot to lead the comeback of a century with one quarter left. Jalen delivered and

finished with a touchdown pass and the game winning score when he ran the ball 15-yards with one minute left on the clock.

Alabama went on to the College Football Playoffs and beat Oklahoma in the first round with Tua back in the starting position. Clemson and Alabama played for the National Championship for the third time in four years. It was the Clemson Tigers that was victorious and won its' third National Championship.

Without Hurts commitment to stay ready, Alabama would not have been in the Championship. He stayed loyal to the Tide the whole year after being benched. After the year, Hurts entered the transfer portal as an Alabama legend that will be beloved by all Bama fans because of his commitment to the team.

Jalen Hurts is now the starting quarterback at the University of Oklahoma and is set to play his first game Sunday, September 1st when the Sooners take the field against the Houston Cougars in Norman. Many experts have picked the Sooners to make the CFP and face the Crimson Tide in the semi-final. Undoubtably, it will be an incredible journey for Hurts in his last year to make it to the top.
